

As I See It

September has arrived with its many changes in the weather, the ending of the baseball season, the beginning of the football season, the falling of leaves, and several other areas which are topics which interest us. I like the change, but like many of you, it seems that the seasons roll around too quickly. The pace seems to hasten as we grow older.

I am fortunate to be exposed to a lot of different activities in the world of church, in the world of sports, in the world of vacation adventures, in the world of family relationships, in the world of special interests, and in the world of unknown adventures. The more of these which I have, the more crowded my world is. At times it may seem to overwhelm me, but I am never in the arena of boredom. In some of these areas of attention, I give thanks to you for showing them to me and helping me understand their value.

There is an old gospel hymn which begins like this: "There is joy in serving Jesus, as I journey on my way. Joy that fills the heart with praises, every moment and every day. There is joy, joy joy in serving Jesus, joy that throbs within my heart; every moment, every hour. As I draw upon His power, there is joy, joy, joy that never shall depart."

The beauty about serving Jesus is this: there is no season when it ends. There is a season when it begins for each of us who have confessed Jesus as Lord and Savior but there is no season finale until the Lord calls us home. What we do in our service to the Lord may change over time, but we are never to be on the sidelines. Our call of service is important regardless of the level of exposure to the limelight in which we may be.

Many of you enjoy football. You enjoy the dramatic plays of offense and defense. You enjoy the schemes which are drawn up by the coaches. You groan at the missed opportunities by the different players. Before the actions on the stage of the football field ever occur, there are those who will never be recognized for their participation in the grand scheme of things. Some of these may seem to be minor, but without them there can be a different outcome and maybe even controversy may prevail.

Think of those who prepare the room for film review, responsible for dry erase markers, washing the uniforms and undergarments of the players, preparing the water for the sidelines and timeouts, lining the field in proper order, erecting the goal posts, making sure the footballs are at the proper psi and that the teams have their own footballs, those who practice against the first team of players, and the rest of the unseen list of things which go on and on. So many in this group have a great amount of joy in doing their tasks.

Let us transfer that thought over to the church. Yes, there are those who are easily seen in the work that they do, but their work will not be as successful without the support of others who are not as visible. When I look at Sunday mornings, there are at least eleven people who are a part of the Sunday morning service. On Sundays when communion is served, there may be as many as twenty who are involved, but that does not include those who fold the bulletins, made the list of those who are scheduled to serve, made sure the Sunday School and sanctuary are ready for worship, those who sing in the choir or are in hand chimes, those who serve in different capacities as listed on the back of the bulletin.

Without the active involvement of each member, the best results are not met and the potential joy is not achieved. The Christian season does not have a break. There is no championship game. Let us strive to be the children of GOD we are meant to be and feel the "Joy in Serving Jesus" in all of our journey.

I look forward to being in your presence each Sunday. Let us serve the Lord with gladness and come before Him with singing for He is our salvation. Because of the Christ who loves us so, let us love one another.

A Birthday Party!


We were pleased to be able to celebrate with Bruce and Harriette Heiserman as they reached their 90th birthdays. Happy birthday to you, and many more!

Thanks to the OK Club for the cake and ice cream, and the CPWM for the flowers.


